

It allows users of NLM services to initiate searches from one Web interface, searching two databases: Meeting Abstracts and Health Services Research Projects (HSRProj).

Search Help

If you need help using a particular research tool listed on CLIC-On-Health, check out the **Tutorials for Health Professionals page** ([http://www.cliconhealth.org/Training/Local Health Professionals/Tutorials/](http://www.cliconhealth.org/Training/Local_Health_Professionals/Tutorials/)). It provides a number of walkthrough video guides developed by RRLC and other trustworthy organizations like the National Library of Medicine to help you with your search.

Understanding the following search concepts will also help you in your search:

- **Limitier:** A search option that will reduce the number of results you get to only those articles that match your criteria. If “Spanish” is your limiter, for example, then you will not see English articles in your search results, you will only get back articles in Spanish.
- **Full Text search:** A method of searching that involves telling the search engine to examine all of the words in every stored document to see if any of the words match the search terms used. Some databases use “Search entire article”.
- **Full Text article:** Article databases store both abstracts (brief summaries) of articles and entire articles. A full text article includes the whole text of the article.
- **Automatic Term Mapping:** A method of searching in PubMed that matches up keyword search terms with the medical vocabulary MeSH (Medical Subject Headings).
- **Peer Reviewed Article:** An article that has been reviewed by professionals in the field to ensure that it represents the best possible scholarship on the topic.

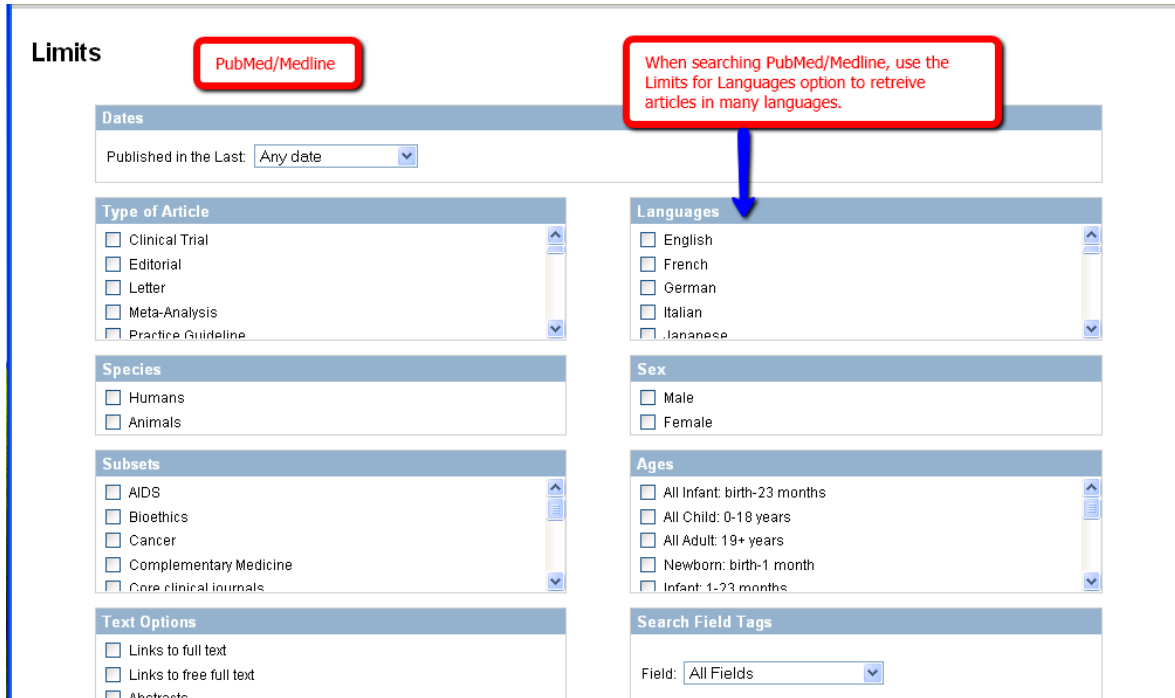

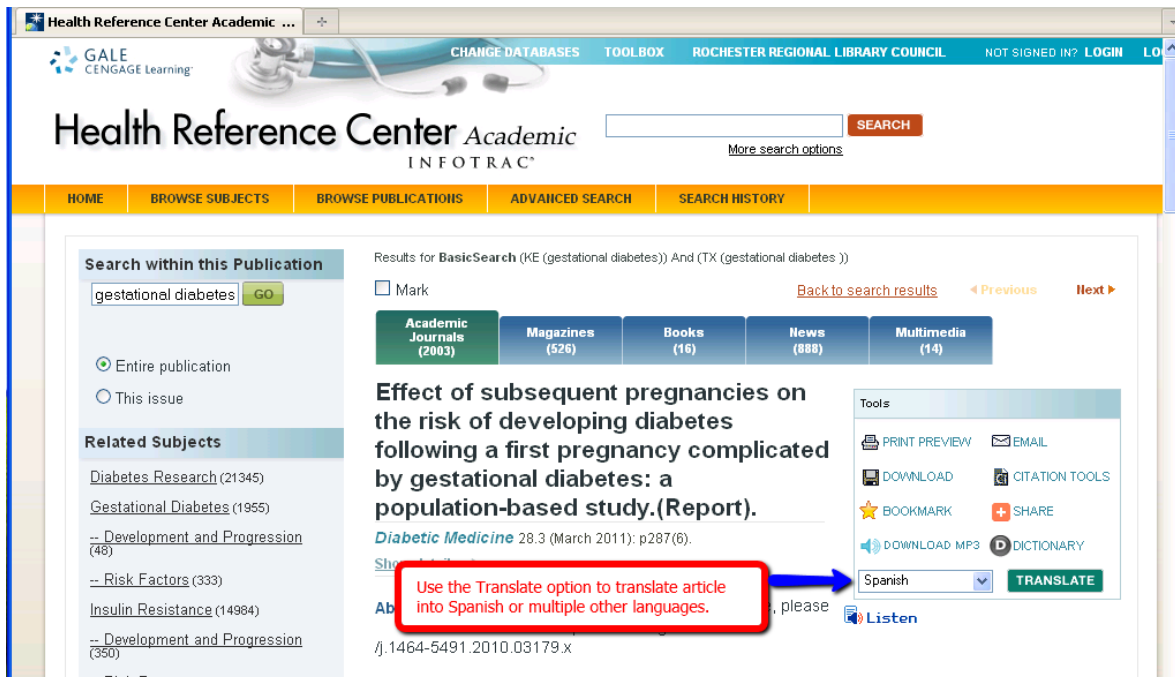
Articles in Spanish and other languages

There are a variety of ways to access health information in Spanish from CLIC-On-Health:

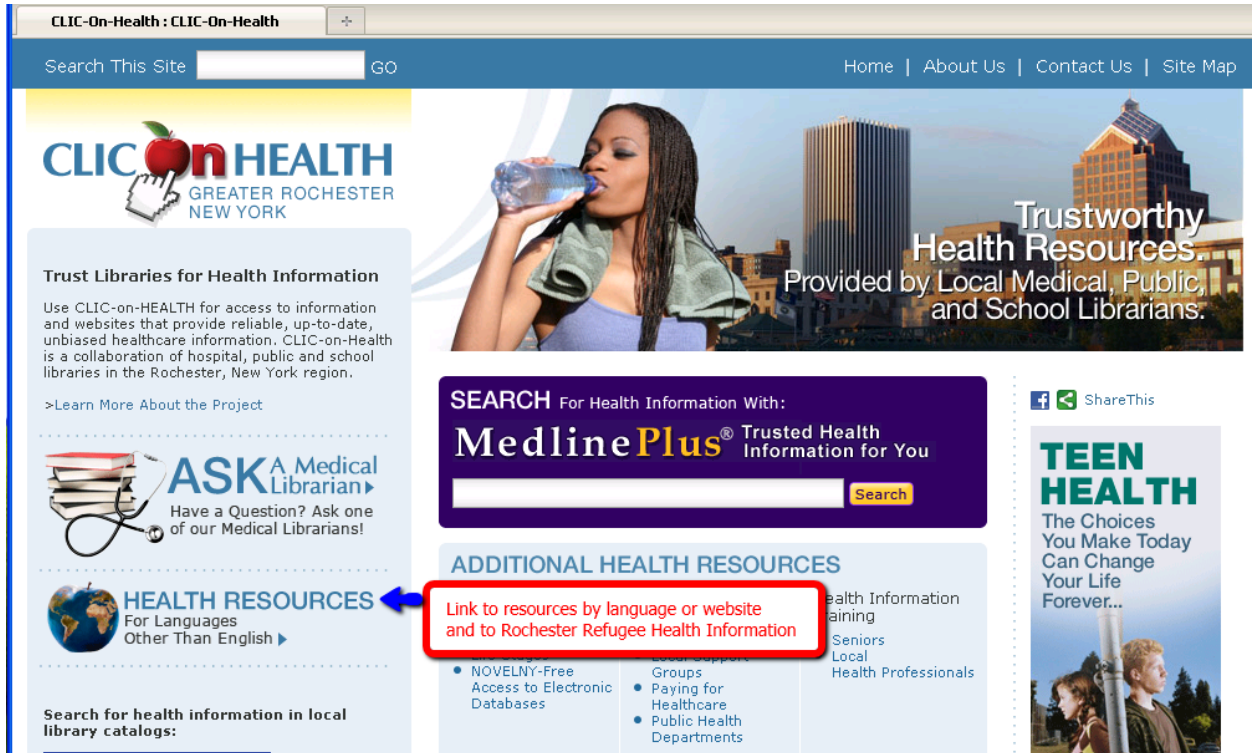
- Navigate to **PubMed/Medline** (http://www.cliconhealth.org/Training/Local_Health_Professionals/Medline/) and use a limiter.



- Use **NOVELNY** databases (http://www.cliconhealth.org/Information_Services/NOVELNY/) and select the translate option.



- Navigate to the CLIC-On-Health home page (<http://cliconhealth.org/>) and select the **Health Resources page** link (<http://www.cliconhealth.org/HealthResources/>). Then choose to view links to resources by language, by website, or view links to Rochester Refugee Health Information.



- From the Local Health Professionals page (http://www.cliconhealth.org/Training/Local_Health_Professionals/), select the **Consumer Health page** (http://www.cliconhealth.org/Training/Local_Health_Professionals/Consumer_Health/). Many of the resources listed on the Consumer Health Page (such as MedlinePlus, HealthFinder, and National Cancer Institute) will allow you to search for information in multiple languages.
