With nearly 4.2 million articles this database provides access to 1,115 journals with a strong emphasis on the **full text titles cited in CINAHL**.

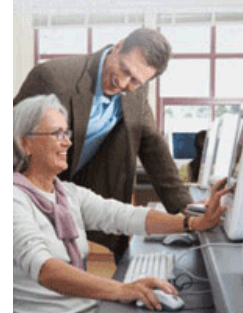
Clinical Practice Guidelines/Best Practices
